

NATIONAL INDEPENDENT VENUE ASSOCIATION SET TO TESTIFY BEFORE SENATE PANEL AS THE INDUSTRY DESPERATELY WAITS FOR CONGRESS TO PASS THE SAVE OUR STAGES ACT

Dec. 14, 2020 – Co-chair of <u>The National Independent Venue Association</u>'s Advocacy Committee, Adam Hartke, who owns WAVE and The Cotillion in Wichita, and has been invited to testify before the Senate Committee on Commerce Tuesday, Dec. 15 at 10am ET.

This hearing before a the Subcommittee on Manufacturing, Trade, and Consumer Protection, which is chaired by U.S. Senator Jerry Moran (R-Kan.), will examine the impact of COVID-19 on the live entertainment industry and will focus on the challenges faced by artists, venues, and supporting industries such as lighting and transportation. Proposals for legislative relief including unemployment compensation, healthcare subsidies, and the Save Our Stages Act will be examined.

As more time passes without the emergency relief, venues continue to disappear. Already, hundreds of venues have shuttered permanently since COVID-19 forced the industry to a standstill in March. NIVA supports the Save Our Stages Act led by Senators John Cornyn (R-TX) and Amy Klobuchar (D-MN) and led by Representatives Peter Welch (D-VT) and Roger Williams (R-TX) which would provide a critical lifeline for independent venues. The bill has significant bipartisan support with more than 230 co-sponsors. NIVA also supports extension of the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance for the millions that have been furloughed and laid off.
